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

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


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PEACE ON EARTH

CELEBRATING EASTER

Making Hot Cross Buns

Hot Cross Buns are an Easter favourite. Follow this 2 part recipe for an amazing squishy delicious sweet bread.

INGREDIENTS

- 75g caster Sugar
- 500g Flour
- 50g Butter
- 1 Egg, 300ml Milk
- 125g Currants
- 1/2 tsp. ground Cinnamon
- 1/4 tsp. ground Nutmeg
- 1 tsp. Salt
- 7g sachet Yeast
- 1 Lemon zest



PART 1

Mix milk, yeast, a pinch of sugar in a bowl and leave it for 30mins.

Whisk egg yolk, with butter into the mixture.

Combine flour, sugar, salt, cinnamon and nutmeg in another bowl.

Make a hole in the center, add the yeast mixture and stir.

Add in the currants and stir until the mixture is thick.

On a flat surface, sprinkle flour.

Knead the dough on the surface for 10mins, until it is stretchy.

Put the dough into a large bowl, cover with cling film and allow it
to rise for 1hr 30mins. The dough will double in size.

Making Hot Cross Buns



PART 2

Shape the dough into a rectangle and cut portions with a knife. Roll each portion into a ball. Place into a buttered baking pan.

Allow it to rest in a warm place for about 45mins.

Brush the tops with egg white.

For the glaze, whisk caster sugar, milk and lemon zest until smooth and put into a piping bag. Pipe a cross shape over each bun.

Bake in a preheated oven (200C) for 20-25mins until golden.

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

In 1953, Queen Elizabeth II was crowned Queen of England and other realms.

I'm sure our Queen has inspired you to know that just like her you can do good for yourself and for others.

Queen Elizabeth II became queen at the age of 25. Growing up, she had a fun childhood playing with her sister Margaret in a large house in London. Unlike most children, her and her sister did not go to school but were taught at home by a governess. As a child the Queen was described as a cheeky little girl who liked to pull the occasional prank.

Her Tween and Early Teenage Years

But by the age of 11 she began to mature and realised it was time to broaden her educational knowledge by studying something very close and dear to her heart, European history. But something disrupted her learning and this was the second world war which began in 1939.

Family Life During the War

Whilst the war was ongoing, it was proposed that Elizabeth and Margaret should be evacuated to Canada. But her mother wouldn't allow anything of the sort to happen; she said, "The children will never go anywhere without me. I won't leave the king. And the king won't leave." And in the end, it was decided that they should stay. Although this resulted in them moving from house to house: first staying in Balmoral, followed by Sandringham and then Windsor.

Teenage Training and Achievements

In July 1944 (just before her 18th birthday) she went to the Italian battlefields; she later trained as a driver and mechanic and by the end of the course was an intelligent driver and clever mechanic.





The Last Supper & Good Friday

Jesus was Betrayed & Denied

Good Friday


The following day, Jesus was sent to be crucified on a cross. Although they didn't find anything wrong He had done.

Please forgive me." Jesus then told Him that any one who believed in His name and asked for His mercy is worthy to go to Heaven.

After a while, the soldiers who crucified Jesus gave Him some wine from a sponge on a stick. After drinking it, He said, "It is finished", and died.

To make sure He was dead, a soldier threw his spear at Jesus' heart and blood and water flowed out.

Jesus' mother, some women and three of His disciples including two Pharisees who believed Him, took His body down from the cross and buried Him in a tomb. All of them went home very sad.


